

#### Karen McCarthy – Vice President of Public Policy & Federal Relations, National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (NASFAA)

Karen McCarthy serves as vice president of public policy and federal relations at the National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (NASFAA), where she leads the association's federal advocacy strategy and public policy initiatives. As NASFAA's chief lobbyist and primary liaison to Congress and the U.S. Department of Education, Karen plays a central role in shaping national financial aid policy and legislative efforts.

Karen has held multiple leadership roles within NASFAA, where she has overseen public policy development, regulatory analysis, research initiatives, and stakeholder engagement. Her work has been instrumental in advancing federal student aid policy, simplifying the FAFSA process, and ensuring effective communication between policymakers and practitioners.

#### Eric Zarnikow, Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC)

Eric Zarnikow is Executive Director of the Illinois Student Assistance Commission, the state's college access and financial aid agency. ISAC provides comprehensive, objective, and timely information on education and financial aid for students and their families – giving them access to the tools they need to make the educational choices that are right for them. Then, through the state's scholarship and grant programs ISAC administers, including the state's flagship Monetary Award Program, ISAC can help students make those choices a reality.

Eric is a former Associate Administrator at the U.S. Small Business Administration, where he led the office of Capital Access, responsible for all the agency's programs and operations concerning financial assistance to small businesses, 800 employees and a \$90 billion loan and investment portfolio. Prior to his work with the SBA, Eric spent over 25 years in the private sector, including serving as Senior Vice President, Chief Risk Officer and Treasurer at ServiceMaster. Eric serves on several commissions and is a former trustee of The College Board. A certified public accountant, Eric received his bachelor's degree from Iowa State University and MBA from Drake University.

#### Stephanie Schmitz-Bechteler, Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC)

Stephanie Schmitz-Bechteler is the Managing Director of Program Services and Compliance at the Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC), where she oversees the administration of ISAC's gift assistance programs. 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

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
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
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
